Inspection Report

Bholaram Shiblall Kharakia College (15.2.1967)  
P.O. Maithan Dam, Dist. Dhanbad.  
(Exchange 2701, ask for Inspection Bungalow).

We inspected the College on 15.2.1967 from 11.30 to 14.30 hours. The classes are at present held in the D.V.C. School behind the Inspection Bungalow during night (17.30 to 21.30 hours). The College is free to use four large rooms (seating 80) and six smaller rooms (seating 40). The accommodation and ancillary facilities are very satisfactory.

The College is at present maintaining a staff of nine lecturers (English, Hindi, Bengali, Civics, Psychology, History, Geography, Economics, Commerce - one each) and a Principal (Pol. Science). Particulars of classes held at present are as follows:

The State University Commission has signified affiliation to these classes from July, 1967. The status of students is therefore private in each of these classes. The fees charged are 12/- per Ist. year and 13/- per 2nd. year. The fee income is therefore Rs. 372 + 403 + 360 + 364 = Rs. 1499/- per month whereas the acquittance roll shows a disbursement of Rs. 2884/- per month on the salary of teacher alone. The deficit is entirely met at present by the founder-donor, Shri Raghunath Agrawala, Proprietor of the Maithan Ceramic Private Ltd., who has factories and mines close by.

There are two secondary and twelve higher Secondary Schools within a radius of seven miles. The approaches to the College are good and means of transport easy and frequent.

The College (present site and permanent site) overlooks the West Bengal border and quite a rush of Hindi speaking boys and girls may be expected from Kultti, Barakar and other neighbouring localities.

The assets of the College include (i) a cash balance of Rs. fifty thousand and one as on Jan.14,1967 vide United Coml. Bank Pass Book No. M-1250, (2) a plot of fine land, twenty bighas on the main approach road to Maithan Dam from Mt. 2, and cartiguous to the D.V.C. Hospital ( Mauza Merah, Revenue Survey No. 1229, Collectory Register No. 321, P.S. Chirkunda (Nirsa) 2517. (3) completed foundation of the front portion of the permanent proposed building ( Arts and Commerce). (4) Guarantee in the forms of a letter to the Secretary, B.S.U. Commission, Patna from the founder-Secretary( Shri R.Agrawala) and the President of the Governing Body (Shri B.Parthsarathy, Chief Civil Engineer of D.V.C. at Maithan), stating that Shri Agrawala would under-write not only the entire capital expenditure but also recurring expenses.

The Plan of the proposed building ( in two floors) is ambitious, with separate portions earmarked for commerce, Arts and Science. All the building materials are either available locally or may be procured from the ancillaries of Shri Agrawala's enterprizes. There is little to doubt that he will put up the building withing 1967. The ad hor Gov. body includes Shri Parthsarathy, Shri Agrawala, the welfare commissioner, the local B.D.O. and seven others.

After discussions with us, the Principal restated his proposals for affiliation as follows:-

- (i) Further temporary affiliation in Mathenatics, Pol. Science, Sanskrit, Principa Hindi, Bengali and Urdu, upto B.A.Part.I standard. It appears from lafer discussion with the Registrar that the only temp. affiliation from Ranchi University is for Pre-Arts.

- (ii) Temp. affiliation upto B.Com. Part I Standard from the session 1966-67.
- (iii) Temp. affiliation up to the B.A. Final Standard from the session 1966-67.
- (iv) Temp. affiliation upto B.Sc. Part I Standard from the session beginning July, 1967.

We are much impressed by the sincere effort of Shri Raghunath Agrawala. We also believe that in due course the D.V.C. will help the College in larged measure. We feel that every thing should be done to help the College.

After careful considerations of all the circumstances we recommend as follows:-

- (i) Temporary affiliation to the B.S.K. College, Maithan, may be granted from July, 1967 upto B.A. Part I standard with the addition of mathematics, Pol. Science, Sanskrit, Pr. Hindi and Bengali over and above the subjects approved already for the Pre-Arts Standard, provided that one lecturer each is appointed in mathematics and sanskrit and necessary minimum of books maintained in the library.
- (ii) Temp. affiliation in Commerce upto the B.Com. Part I Standard may be granted from July, 1967, but the number of seats should not exceed fifty at present, and the necessary books should be provided in the library.
- (iii) The College should take immediate steps to appoint its lecturers and the Principal through the U.G. Commission, Patna.
- (iv) The College should report to the University when its permanent building is complete and fitted up, so that the question of the remaining affiliations may be taken up.
- (v) The shingth of no class at present should excend eighty.
